  - Director of the CWCB
  - State Engineer
  - Attorney General
  - Director of Parks & Wildfire
  - Commissioner of Agriculture



## WATER FOR THE 21st CENTURY ACT

- Creates 9 basin roundtables from 8 major river basins.
- Establishes the Interbasin Compact Committee (IBCC)
- CWCB coordinates with both groups

Implementation, though, is a statewide effort and we marvel at the actions, great and small, that water stakeholders have accomplished since the Water Plan was issued.




